
Value of the Week

Welcome back to school after the half term holiday! The season of Lent has begun. The pancakes were tossed in half term and now Christians have entered into a period of fasting and a time to nurture their faith; asking for forgiveness and considering the needs of others. In a short time, many in our community will be fasting during Ramadan and this will also deepen faith and promote time to consider the needs of the most disadvantaged. Living without luxuries focuses the mind and enables us to see the things we take for granted.

Our faiths teach us to respect one another and to respect the planet and its resources. So in worship this week, we explored the value of "wisdom" as we seek to "Succeed" in enriching one another as well as the earth. Ms Wright explained that she has given up some luxuries, to spend more on shopping items which benefit those who are less fortunate. Buying more expensive toilet roll (made of bamboo), not wrapped in plastic and where profits go to help build toilets in Ghana, is one small

way to help others, as well as the earth. Bamboo produces 30% more oxygen than trees, absorbs 35% more carbon dioxide than trees and grows back far more quickly. Buying Fairtrade products also benefits others, as well as giving to charity at this time. Children and families are invited to join in with a challenge to help the earth and others too!

We remembered the words of Archbishop Desmond Tutu who invited us always to do something, even if only a small thing, to help others and to help the world.





'Healthy Earth Healthy US'

The Values Leaders will be working hard to encourage children and families to give something up which helps the planet. Next week, we will be exploring ways in which we can eradicate single use plastics from school. So many children bring food and snacks to school wrapped in single use plastics. Much of this food isn't healthy for our bodies either. We will also be encouraging healthy eating and hope that children will consider giving something up for Lent and to choose healthier options in their diet.

"Healthy Earth Healthy US" will be our slogan for the weeks leading

up to Easter.

It would be wonderful if families could join in with our theme for Lent as we encourage the most disadvantaged, living in countries affected by climate change.

Easter is Coming

During our R.E. lessons, we will be learning themes from the Easter story. Each class will also be "getting vocal" in their learning, using oracy skills (speaking and listening) to share their understanding of a small section of the story. The classes will be creating some artefacts for a special treasure hunt in the Environmental Area and which will be signposted with donkeys. The donkeys and artefacts when found, reveal a letter which will spell out a word (when written in the order of the Easter story). We have bought a small Fairtrade chocolate egg for each child who visits the trail during the last week of term and families are invited to do the trail for themselves after school on Wednesday 27th March and staff will be on hand to help and it will be Ms Wright's last community event before leaving at the end of term.

Junior pupils will also visit church for a special Easter experience. A "Question Time" panel of Easter characters will tell them more about the Easter story and children will receive a drink and a snack. The Easter experience is always a real treat!




World Book Day – Thursday 7th March

World Book Day will take place after half term and the Class Librarians met with Miss Booth to discuss their ideas. They will launch a competition, like last year, where children model a character and enter it into a competition. The prize will be hot chocolate, a book mark, book and popcorn or cookies!

Children may come to school on World Book Day wearing/bringing 3 items to hint at a book character. We will then spend the day trying to work out who the characters are. For example, red shoes, a blue bow and a basket might represent Dorothy from the Wizard of Oz. A scar, a wand and a wizard's hat would clearly be "Harry Potter".

There are a few weeks to go so that families and children can put on their thinking caps! Staff will also share 3 clues with the children so that they can guess their book character too!
