The Role of the Learning mentor

Miss Livesey and Mrs Islam can offer the following support:

- Advice on promoting positive behaviour, routines and boundaries at home.
- Liaising with a range of external agencies and referring your family or your child for additional support.

- Supporting families who are experiencing difficult times for example financial crisis, family breakdown etc.
- Providing help for families with any worries they may have in regards to their children's education, behaviour and well-being.

Mrs Islam also works with our school attendance officer, Mrs Valentine, to support families to improve attendance and punctuality.

Miss Livesey also works closely with Teaching Assistants, Teachers and the Emotional Literacy Support Assistant to co-ordinate and manage the nurture provision for the children.
