#### Value of the Week

This week we celebrated the value of "trust" as we learned about Ruth who, when her husband died, stayed with her mother-in-law Naomi. It was usual for women to return to their birth family on these occasions but Ruth chose to stay with Naomi so that they could support one another. They moved to Bethlehem to begin a new life. It wasn't easy for them to find food and support in their new home but Ruth was hardworking and caring. A relative of Naomi's came to know Ruth and he saw that both women were looked after. His name was Boaz and he became Ruth's husband.

The story tells us to trust God that He will be there when new challenges come. The big picture of what could happen in our futures isn't known to us but we can trust God in all things. Boaz became a support to the women and we like to support all newcomers to our school by extending friendliness and care.

We also learned about Tyrus Wong who travelled to the USA from China with his father when young. His father worked very hard and Tyrus also worked hard and it was very difficult for them to settle and make a living in the USA. However, he showed a talent for painting. He was an aspiring artist whose talents were eventually used in the production of the Disney film "Bambi". Whilst his welcome to the USA was very frosty, Tyrus proved that he and his father had skills which benefitted others. We have reflected on the skills and talents that can be brought by those who travel to the UK and we believe that we can welcome newcomers with joy at what they can offer to our community. 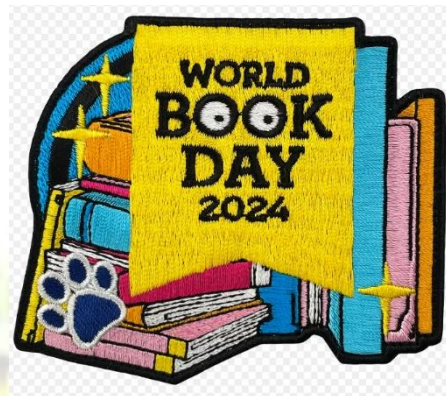


### World Book Day – Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> March

There are a few weeks to go so that families and children can put on their thinking caps! Staff will also share 3 clues with the children so that they can guess their book character too!
