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<p><b>10 January</b> – God has no favourites – based on Acts 10; <i>reflecting on our friendships. Sometimes we pick and choose; allowing our favourite people to be on our team or only letting certain people play with us. God isn't like that; He welcomes everyone and doesn't like it when people get left out.</i></p>	<p><b>7 February</b> – A tale of Two Houses – based on Matthew 7; <i>looking at two different approaches to how we build our lives just as the two men built their houses in different ways. If we listen to wise words we can build a strong life. Whose words will we listen to and whose words will we ignore?</i></p>	<p><b>14 March</b> – Hezekiah trusts God – based on 2 Kings 20; <i>reflecting on the fact that throughout his life Hezekiah tried his best to please God but at the end of his life he had to trust that God knew best about his life and so he prayed to him. Thinking about their own lives who do they think knows best – God? Mum? Dad? Their teacher? Or all of them?</i></p>	<p>Humility – exploring sacrifice and humbling oneself in the face of aggression.</p> <p>As classes reflect on Jesus' sacrifice, we should remember the theme of humility which unfolds in the Easter Story...</p> <p>Washing the disciples feet, praying for strength to face a challenge, non-retaliation to violence,</p>

"If you had been the widow with just enough food for your family for one day would you have shared what you had?" Think about the many people in the world who don't have enough food, is there anything we can do to help?</i></p>		<p><b>11 July</b> – Walking on Water – based on Matthew 14; <i>reflecting on the fact that like Peter, there are times when we get scared. Who do we ask to help us when we are scared? How did we learn to trust that person? The Bible says that we can trust God to help us.</i></p>
