# This Week's Worship Value continues with

## "A" for Achieve

This week, in our worship, we continued "A" for Achieve and explored further the idea of "truthfulness" as part of our values. On Monday, Vicar Dave Jaunched the week with a talk about the value of staying truthful when it's difficult. He told the story of St. Peter, who told a lie three times but Christ forgave him. We also heard a story about a girl who started to tell a small lie but then her story became more complex with a layer of lies.

Truthfulness is such an honourable quality and our classes thought really hard about this value over the course of the week. We have heard in the news recently of calls for honesty when ministers debate in the House of Commons and there have been questions raised between MPs about senior leaders in government. Children were able to watch a BBC Newsround clip where young people gave their differing views on the recent reports. We have also reflected on the responsibilities placed on those who manage social media environments. For example, Mark Zuckerberg who has plans to create a "Metaverse", a virtual world of online experiences. We teach our children to surf the internet safely and to be wary of false news. In the future we may need to teach them to differentiate between what is real and what is not.



As we encourage our children to grow up around all of these influences, we need to hold on to our values of truthfulness and to seek the truth. Jesus said, "I am the way, the truth and the life". To be able to look to his clear message of love for one another will be a perpetual guide.

This week, the Year 3/4 worship leaders reflected on the value of truth. They shared their words in Thursday's assembly.
