### As we explore "P" for "Persevere"

The summer term has begun with sunny weather and our children have enjoyed a return to school with a chance to play outdoors in sunshine. We look forward to our Summer Term events which include Jubilee celebrations, a Year 6 production and a school fundraiser.

In our worship this week, we heard the story of the widow's mite. A very poor woman entered the temple and gave her last coin to the offertory box. Jesus made the point that she had given more than the rich person who emptied several coins into the same box. "Giving her all" the lady had demonstrated her care for God's work and was to be celebrated.

We have also learned more about the inspirational life of Sir Tom Moore. We will remember Sir Tom, who reached his 100<sup>th</sup> birthday whilst walking 100 lengths of his garden for charity. He inspired others with disabilities, to take difficult steps to raise awareness or funds to support others. Our classes have been asked to consider endurance challenges and where they may be able to raise funds for their class charities or to think about how they can raise expectations of themselves so that they can achieve highly.

#### **Covid Updates**

The current health advice for Covid is:

- adults with the symptoms of a respiratory infection, and who have a high temperature or feel unwell, should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until they feel well enough to resume normal activities and they no longer have a high temperature
- children and young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They can go back to school, college or childcare when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend

- adults with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 5 days, which is when they are most infectious. For children and young people aged 18 and under, the advice will be 3 days
- regular asymptomatic testing is no longer recommended in any education or childcare setting. Schools will no longer be able to order test kits

Schools should not hand out any test kits to staff, pupils, or students unless advised by their local health protection team, local authority or director of public health.
