This has been a very special week as we have approached our school Jubilee celebration today. On Monday, we learned about the enduring leadership of the Queen and her desired legacy of planting a tree for her Platinum Jubilee. During the week, we also explored the life of Mama Miti (Wangari Maathai) who campaigned for the saving of forests in Kenya and promoted the planting of trees. More than 30 million trees have been planted since 1977 when she founded the Green Belt Movement to combat deforestation. This was a key part of her Christian Faith as she sought to protect God's earth. Her dedication led to her being the first African woman to earn the Nobel Peace Prize. You can read her story here:

Jubilee


