On Monday, we welcomed the "Open the book" team as they performed the story of the Centurian's servant. The Centurian was upset because his servant lay dying. He asked Jesus for help, even though he didn't feel he could because he was Roman. Jesus healed his servant to show that he would help all equally. As we reflect on healing, we are grateful for our NHS service, which developed after World War 2 with the remit of healing all equally.

As part of our reflection on justice for all, we learned about the life of Florence Nightingale, whose values of healing others inspired the founders of the Red Cross charity. Not only did this lady carry a lamp she also allowed her light to shine as a dedicated healer of others. This is an example to us all as we allow our lights to shine.

Year 5D were able to take the themes of this week to produce an assembly about the value of healing others equally. Thank you children for producing a very thoughtful assembly.

## **National Time of Mourning**

Last week, we heard the very sad news that our much beloved monarch, Queen Elizabeth II passed away and since this time many have shown their respects to a dedicated monarch.
