Do they need to make a change in their own life? (Y6 children x 8)</i></p> <p><i>*Jesus talks about forgiveness for sins, second chances. The proud needed more forgiveness. Pick up your mat!</i></p>		<p>*5th Nov Diwali/Bonfire Night</p> <p>9 November – The Storm on the Lake – based on Mark 4; <i>reflecting on how we worry about things. Think about the things that make us feel worried or afraid. Can they remember how they stopped feeling scared? (Y5 children x 10) Jesus is the peacemaker. Teach ‘waymaker’ song</i></p> <p>11th Nov- Remembrance</p> <p><i>*Friendship wk (16th Nov)</i></p>		<p>Advent wreath- Each class makes an advent wreath</p> <p>9 December – The Marvellous Picnic – based on Matthew 14; <i>reflecting on how everyone in the story had enough to eat but thinking about all those people in the world who don’t have enough to eat. What can we do? (Y1/2 children x 10)</i></p> <p>Contrast feasting with those who are hungry. Courageous advocacy-Foxton centre/Salvation Army</p> <p>The First Christmas Jesus brings hope to the world. Jesus the bringer of Love, Hope, Joy and Peace</p>

<p>11 January – Jesus and the children – based on Mark 10; <i>reflecting on how sometimes grown ups can seem too busy to talk with children yet Jesus made time for them. How does it feel when someone makes an effort to stop what they are doing to be with you? (Y3/4 children x 8)</i></p> <p>*Jesus trusted children and they trusted him.</p>		<p>8 February – An important meal – based on Mark 14; <i>reflecting on how even though Jesus was sad, as he knew what must happen, he wanted to be with his friends and have a meal with them. Thinking about times when they have had a special time with friends or family. (Y3 children x 8)</i></p> <p>*Jesus knew Judas would betray him. <i>Telling the truth is not always easy but God knows what is in our heart. The value of honesty.</i></p>		<p>8 March – A Dreadful Day – based on John 19; <i>reflecting on the fact that this story is remembered every year on Good Friday. Why is it called ‘good’ when it was such a sad day? Sometimes sad things happen to us too. Think of a time when they were sad, what made them happy again? (Y2 children x 8)</i></p> <p>*Wisdom- <i>People who contribute to the death of Jesus did not have wisdom</i></p>		<p>10 May – A Happy Day – based on Luke 24; <i>reflecting on the fact that Christians celebrate this story every year on Easter Sunday; for them this is the most important story of all. Think of about the part of the story where the women saw Jesus alive again. Imagine how wonderful that must have felt</i></p> <p><i>Humility of Jesus as servant King</i></p> <p>**21st May Pentecost (is Sunday 23rd)</p> <p>12th May- Eid enrichment</p>

Close your eyes and think of a time when that has happened to you. Maybe you've got upset about something someone said or did. Think about it now; was it really so important? Did you know that God was there with you?</i></p> <p><i>*Link to endurance of the journey</i></p>		<p>12 July – Goodbye at Last – based on Luke 24; <i>reflecting on the fact that Jesus loved his friends a lot and often thanked God for them, think about your friends, what they mean to you. Do you thank God for them? (Y1 children x 10)</i></p> <p><i>Reflect on thanking God and God's constant generosity to us</i></p>
